# The Extended Project Qualification, AQA – Level 3

### What is an EPQ?

- The Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) is a Level 3 course which is taken alongside A-levels.
- You'll be required to complete a project based on a research topic of your choice. It can be related to a subject outside of your current areas of study.
- The project can be in the form of an essay or report; or an artefact, musical composition or dramatic project (backed up with paperwork).

# Why do an EPQ?

- An EPQ will help you develop a useful range of extra study skills, helping you prepare for the demands of university work.
- It is valued amongst Higher Education institutions as it demonstrates your dedication to independent learning.
- It contributes towards entry requirements at some universities. Some universities will even lower their grade requirements.

# Choosing an EPQ topic

- You can study any topic you wish but it's a good idea to choose something related to the subject that you intend to study at university.
- An EPQ gives you the opportunity to expand learning in an area that really interests you, so don't be afraid to go beyond your A-level syllabus.
- Do try to be specific, as it will help you to focus your research and develop a great project.
- Your title must be agreed by your supervisor and then by KHO (Co-Ordinator)

# A completed EPQ

- All projects must include a written report of at least 1000 words.
- However, the outcome of the EPQ can be almost anything. For example: a
  dissertation, an artefact or model, a performance, a short film, a website or piece
  of software, a design or blueprints. This must be based in research, which you
  must present!
- If you choose to complete an essay this must be 5000 words.
- Once complete, you must also give a short presentation about your project.

### How is your EPQ assessed?

- Assessment is undertaken by your supervisor and externally moderated by the exam board. Grades are awarded in the range A\*-E.
- You will be assessed in the following areas:
- Management
- Use of resources
- Development and realisation
- Objectives and achievements
