You will experiment with a wide range of textile processes and media with a focus on printed and constructed Textiles and Fashion Design. You will have the opportunity to investigate and experiment with ideas, as well as develop your aesthetic understanding and critical judgement. You will learn to develop your independent thinking, investigating subject matter that intrigues and excites you and design and create personal outcomes.
