The Governors have visited School for the autumn term Governor Day on attainment and progress. This involved meeting with senior leaders and some of the subject heads to discuss the summer 2022 examination results. This included how they monitor attainment and progress across all groups, and what interventions and development initiatives there are for the forthcoming year. We also met with the 6th form leadership team and congratulated them on the exceptional A Level results. Also, there are now 6 career pathways in operation to engage students in more super curricular opportunities, and this will help them to decide what they want to do in the future.
