IN ADDITION

to our A-Level and Level 3 course provision we also offer all students the opportunity to complete an EPQ (Extended Project Qualification), and/or Core Maths. Both of these qualifications are worth up to half of an A-level in UCAS points.

EPQ

students get to choose a topic, research, create a report or product and then deliver a presentation on their project. It is highly respected by universities, and allows students to develop independent research and academic skills essential for further study after A-levels.

CORE MATHS

is an exciting course that complements and supports subject choices as well providing increased employability skills. Students studying Biology, Psychology and Geography are strongly encouraged to take this subject alongside their other A-levels. Increasing numbers of students are opting to study it as it is highly regarded by employers and universities alike. It allows you to continue to study some aspects of Mathematics at Level 3 without having to commit completely to an entire A-Level.

APPLYING

We view it to be a crucial role of the Sixth Form team to ensure students are registered onto courses that both

match their ability and future career goals. Students will select three subjects that they will study over a two-year course with all formal examinations taken at the end of Year 13.

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ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

We have generic minimum entry requirements that all students must meet, and additional requirements for each individual subject they wish to study. Details of these can be found in our accompanying subject postcards.

You will need to gain at least a grade 5 in 5 or more subjects (including Maths or English Language), and show evidence of excellent attendance, motivation and attitude.

Our application form can be found on the Bewdley Sixth Form website. You will be asked to complete a short personal statement as part of your application. Please check your emails regularly as this is where we will contact you.

DECEMBER

Applications close for all The Bewdley School students.

JANUARY

Applications close for external candiates who currently attend other schools.

APRIL

Deadline for accepting your place. You will have received an email explaining whether you have been offered a place. Please click the link in the email if you would like to accept your place at Bewdley Sixth Form.

END OF JUNE/EARLY JULY

We will invite you to join us for taster days. You will be able to attend lessons in your chosen A-level subjects, and find out more about the extra opportunities and enrichment activities that we have to offer. Students that are new to Bewdley Sixth Form will be able to view all of our facilities again and ask any questions about studying here.

AUGUST - GCSE RESULTS DAY

OPPORTUNITIES

Bewdley Sixth Form is committed to providing opportunities which enable students to gain experience of their chosen career paths. Our careers guidance programme is built into the heart of our pastoral support curriculum.

CAREERS PROGRAMME

At Bewdley Sixth Form we want to support all students, whatever their chosen career path may be. We have an extensive programme of careers talks, workshops, trips and visits both in and outside of Sixth Form which support students to find out about the wide range of career, employment and university options available to them. All students will receive one-to-one advice, have access to university subject Taster Day courses, in-house subject workshops (delivered by universities or industry partners), a 'Next Steps Conference' day and will attend a variety of national and 'on site' careers fairs. We work with Springpod to give students unlimited work experience opportunities and sector insights into countless careers.

UNIVERSITY APPLICATIONS



All students will receive one-to-one support and advice from the Sixth Form team. Students will be supported at all stages of the application process; from deciding which course to apply for, to accepting offers and applying for student finance. Students aspiring to study at Russell Group universities, and the most competitive courses, receive additional support with entrance exams and interview preparation. Our Sixth Form tutor programme is aimed at enabling young people to understand some of the key employability skills and encourage and nurture the practice of these skills.

08 NEXT STEPS CAREERS PATHWAYS

PASTORAL

As a Sixth Form we place a significant emphasis on supporting students to adapt to the demands of post-16 study as quickly as possible. Our pastoral system ensures academic support is provided at the earliest opportunity. Students' attendance, punctuality and overall attitude to study are monitored and reported to parents/carers throughout their time with us.

All students are supported by their form tutor, by attending tailored mentor sessions to support individual students to achieve their academic potential, but also to prepare them for their next steps after Sixth Form study. As a part of this programme all students are supported in developing vital skills including:

- Accurate note taking
- Extended writing tips for exams
- Successful independent study plans
- Time management strategies; effective revision techniques

DISCUSSIONS & DEBATES

All students are encouraged to take part in organised philosophical discussions and debates which centre on global current affairs. In addition to the academic support programme, our collaboration with Springpod allows students to explore different careers and undertake a variety of work experience opportunities. We want our students to leave Sixth Form as academically successful students that are well-rounded individuals ready to make the next step in their lives.

SCHOLARS

In addition to the tutor programme, we also run additional sessions and seminars for those students aspiring to the most competitive courses and top universities. Our scholars programme is designed to ready students for applications, interviews and beyond.

STUDY MENTOR

The Sixth Form study mentor ensures that the study room is a productive work space. They also work closely with individuals to support them academically and pastorally. This can be in the form of proof-reading essays, support designing revision timetables or writing a CV. The Sixth Form mentor is there to assist with whatever the individual needs support with.

A major focus of the work we complete, as part of both our pastoral and academic support, is to nurture the independent student who we know will have the skills to be successful at Sixth Form and beyond.

COMMUNICATION

We regard Sixth Form as a three-way partnership between students, staff and home. We communicate regularly with parents/carers and encourage an open dialogue to pre-empt any significant issues before they arise. All of this leads to students accessing their ideal next step.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

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We understand that financial barriers can impact on students' ability to remain in full-time education. In order for all students to access the full curriculum, the 16-19 Sixth Form Bursary is available for those students who demonstrate a genuine need for financial support. Details of how to apply for the bursary can be found on our website.

A number of bursaries and support funds are also allocated throughout the year to those who might need them. Our aim is to remove as many barriers to learning as we possibly can.
